

What is the Life of an Orthodox Christian?

First we must know what Orthodox means. It is not a brand or classification, a particular type, or even as we think, a denomination. Yes, the churches have names that differentiate their types of beliefs... Catholic, Orthodox, Lutheran, Protestant, Baptist etc., but the greater question is: Are you a true Christian? The word 'true' is rendered as 'orthodox.' With a capital "O" it defines not only the truth but the Faith which is followed. As members of the Armenian Church we strive to be faithful, pious, obedient and true, and to live according to the teachings of Christ and move our total being to be IN HIM.

The Orthodox Armenian Christian is one who really experiences the ever presence of God in worshipping him and in the way we live every day. God is the fountain spring of all that exists, life, motion and being who we are. From the very beginning He gave breath to us, putting in us His Image and likeness. The power of this breath which we call "Holy Spirit" fills all things and is everywhere in the world. By His Holy Spirit we can be in communion with God. This is the main endeavor for every Christian: to be true to God, true and complete in praising Him and doing what He commands.

To be Orthodox means to be in full communion with God, to accept what He demands and commands of us, and to be in communion with God, through Him. Christ has made this possible by making life revolve around his Holy Table, the Altar of God from where His sacrifice keeps us connected in His Body and Blood.

When we *take and eat*, as He commands, we are in union with Him to the fullest we can ever be. We are in God. We are true, we are Orthodox in faith, hope and the love of Christ.
