TODAY'S GOSPEL: Luke 19:12-28

He said therefore, "A nobleman went into a far country to receive kingly power and then return. Calling ten of his servants, he gave them ten pounds, and said to them, 'Trade with these till I come.' But his citizens hated him and sent an embassy after him, saying, 'We do not want this man to reign over us.' When he returned, having received the kingly power, he commanded these servants, to whom he had given the money, to be called to him, that he might know what they had gained by trading. The first came before him, saying, 'Lord, your pound has made ten pounds more.' And he said to him, 'Well done, good servant! Because you have been faithful in a very little, you shall have authority over ten cities.' And the second came, saying, `Lord, your pound has made five pounds.' And he said to him, 'And you are to be over five cities.' Then another came, saying, 'Lord, here is your pound, which I kept laid away in a napkin; for I was afraid of you, because you are a severe man; you take up what you did not lay down, and reap what you did not sow.' He said to him, 'I will condemn you out of your own mouth, you wicked servant! You knew that I was a severe man, taking up what I did not lay down and reaping what I did not sow? Why then did you not put my money into the bank, and at my coming I should have collected it with interest?' And he said to those who stood by, 'Take the pound from him, and give it to him who has the ten pounds.' (And they said to him, `Lord, he has ten pounds!') `I tell you, that to every one who has will more be given; but from him who has not, even what he has will be taken away. But as for these enemies of mine, who did not want me to reign over them, bring them here and slay them before me." And when he had said this, he went on ahead, going up to Jerusalem.

PRAYERS AND VISITS FOR THE SICK

THE FEAST OF SAINT STEPHEN

The Feast of Saint Stephen (*Don Soorp Stepanosi*) is a very special feast celebrated in the Armenian Church on **December 25** honoring the first martyr and protodeacon of the Church. It is a day when all the deacons of the Armenian Church are remembered and honored as well.

Saint Stephen (Saint Stepanos) was the first of seven deacons to be ordained by the twelve apostles, and the first Christian martyr. The responsibility of these seven deacons was to take care of the secular needs of the Hellenic (Greek-speaking) Jewish and Christian community in Jerusalem. If we read Acts 6 & 7 we see that Saint Stephen did much more. In Acts 8, we learn that Stephen began to preach the word of God, and "Stephen, full of the grace and power, did great wonders and signs among the people."

Truly feeling the power of God, Saint Stephen worked hard to spread God's name and love in the Jewish community of Jerusalem. However, he became controversial, falsely accused, and was taken to the Sanhedrin, charged with blasphemy and convicted. He was stoned to death as he was cast out of the city. The site of his martyrdom was the eastern gate of Jerusalem, later named after him. As he was being stoned, Stephen prayed, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." Then he knelt down and cried with a loud voice, "Lord, do not hold this sin against them" Acts: 7.59.

In summary: Saint Stephen was the first martyr and also the first protodeacon. His feast day holds much meaning for us as Armenian Christians. Saint Stephen has been an example of Christian life. We honor him on his feast day and honor those who have followed his path.

Today we honor our Deacons and Subdeacons in remembrance of their patron Saint. We thank the Lord for their diligent service to our Holy Church by serving at the Altar for worship, by teaching and instructing our youth to service at worship, by carrying out benevolent acts of charity for the poor and needy, and for rendering the talents and skill for the good and growth of our beloved parish of St. John Armenian Church.

ORIGIN OF "THE TWELVE DAYS OF CHRISTMAS"

There is one Christmas carol that has always baffled us. We may ask what in the world do leaping lords, French hens, swimming swans, and especially the partridge who won't come out of the pear tree have to do with Christmas?

There is an explanation frequently shared about "The Twelve Days of Christmas." It is supposed that from 1558 until 1829, Roman Catholics in England were not permitted to practice their faith openly. Someone during that era wrote this carol as a secret catechism song for young Catholics. It has two levels of meaning: the surface meaning plus a hidden meaning known only to members of their church. Each element in the carol has a code word for a religious reality which the children could easily remember.

- ♦ The partridge in a pear tree was **Jesus Christ**.
- ♦ Two turtle doves were the Old and New Testaments.
- ◆ Three French hens stood for **faith**, **hope and love**.
- The four calling birds were the four gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke & John.
- ◆ The five golden rings recalled the Torah or Law, the first five books of the Old Testament.
- The six geese a-laying stood for the six days of creation.
- Seven swans a-swimming represented the sevenfold gifts of the Holy Spirit--Prophesy, Serving, Teaching, Exhortation, Contribution, Leadership, and Mercy.
- The eight maids a-milking were the eight beatitudes.
- Nine ladies dancing were the nine fruits of the Holy Spirit--Love, Joy, Peace, Patience, Kindness, Goodness, Faithfulness, Gentleness, and Self Control.
- The ten lords a-leaping were the Ten Commandments.
- The eleven pipers piping stood for the eleven faithful disciples.
- ◆ The twelve drummers drumming symbolized the twelve points of belief in the Apostles' Creed.
