Today's Gospel

John 7:37-52

On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and proclaimed, "If any one thirst, let him come to me and drink. He who believes in me, as the scripture has said, 'Out of his heart shall flow rivers of living water.'" Now this he said about the spirit, which those who believed in him were to receive; for as yet the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

When they heard these words, some of the people said, "This is really the prophet." Others said, "This is the Christ." But some said, "Is the Christ to come from Galilee? Has not the scripture said that the Christ is descended from David, and comes from Bethlehem, the village where David was?" So there was a division among the people over him. Some of them wanted to arrest him, but no one laid hands on him.

The officers then went back to the chief priests and Pharisees, who said to them, "Why did you not bring him?" The officers answered, "No man ever spoke like this man!" The Pharisees answered them, "Are you led astray, you also? Have any of the authorities or of the Pharisees believed in him? But this crowd, who do not know the law, are accursed." Nicodemus, who had gone to him before, and who was one of them, said to them, "Does our law judge a man without first giving him a hearing and learning what he does?" They replied, "Are you from Galilee too? Search and you will see that no prophet is to rise from Galilee." (7:37-52)

The Feast of Vartanank

Under this name are commemorated all those martyrs who in the year 451A.D. fell on the battle field of Avarayr for the defense of Christianity against Zoroastrianism (Persian fire worship). The Battle of Vartanantz was the ultimate outcome of the policy of the Persian Court, which aimed at eradicating Christianity both in Persia and its neighboring countries, including Armenia. Vartan and his men proved noble, pious witnesses, inspired by the revitalizing spirit of the Gospel.

For us there is a very special significance in this event of the defense of our faith, because through this defense we find meaning in our existence. The battle of Vartanank acts as an instrument to cement and unify the Armenian Church and the Armenian people. The outcome of this battle proved conclusively that the faith and the spirit of the Armenian people are invincible and that no power on earth can destroy this spirit.

Yeghishe the historian of the battle of Vartanank with marvelous skill of expression, describes the invincibility of the Armenian faith. In reply to the incomparably powerful king of Persia, the Armenian people express their convictions and indomitable courage, saying "From this faith no one can shake us, neither angels, nor men; neither sword, nor fire, nor water, nor any horrid tortures."

The Armenian people are convinced of the impregnability of their faith which is intangible and beyond the reach of the human hand. Vartan, the commander-in chief of the Battle, in his address to his army says, "He who thought that we donned Christianity like a garment has now discovered that as man cannot change the color of the skin so he cannot and will never succeed in altering our minds, because the foundation of Christianity are firmly set on an immovable rock, not only on this earth, but in heaven, where neither rains fall, nor winds blow, nor floods are formed. Although we are on this earth in flesh, we are established in heaven by our faith, where no one can reach the structure built by Christ without the touch of the hand."

Despite the fact that they were convinced of the certainty of death, the Armenian people went into battle ready to sacrifice their lives for immortality. Through Vartanank, the Armenian people raised their merits to a new level. The measure of these merits is the Battle we fought and continue to fight throughout the centuries.

The Battle of Vartanank is not history which we set aside merely as an incident in our past. Rather it is reality and vitality which is repeated and felt from generation to generation. The Battle of Vartanank is ever present; it lives within ourselves. It is no longer a battle of weapon; the time and scene have changed. We are now waging a battle against evil which destroys the family and society; a battle against ignorance and bigotry; a battle against us progressive ideals and ideas; and finally a battle to spread the light of Armenian culture, history, language, arts, and faith. Through these battles will the souls of Vartanank rest in peace and thus shall be truly glorified, to us the message of Vartanank must rekindle an enthusiasm for and belief in the precepts of the Armenian Church, it's values and its traditions. The message must create within us a feeling of brotherly love, and dedicated living in order to carry on the mission of our Church.
