

TODAY'S GOSPEL: MATTHEW 12:38-45

Then some of the scribes and Pharisees said to him, "Teacher, we wish to see a sign from you." But he answered them, "An evil and adulterous generation seeks for a sign; but no sign shall be given to it except the sign of the prophet Jonah. For as Jonah was three days and three nights in the belly of the whale, so will the Son of Man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth. The men of Nineveh will arise at the judgment with this generation and condemn it; for they repented at the preaching of Jonah, and behold, something greater than Jonah is here. The queen of the South will arise at the judgment with this generation and condemn it; for she came from the ends of the earth to hear the wisdom of Solomon, and behold, something greater than Solomon is here.

HAPPY FATHER'S DAY

The idea for creating a day for children to honor their fathers began in Spokane, Washington. A woman by the name of Sonora Smart Dodd thought of the idea for Father's Day while listening to a Mother's Day sermon in 1909. Having been raised by her father. William Jackson Smart, after her mother died, Sonora wanted her father to know how special he was to her. It was her father that made all the parental sacrifices and was, in the eyes of his daughter, a courageous, selfless, and loving man. Sonora's father was born in June, so she chose to hold the first Father's Day celebration in Spokane, Washington on the 19th of June, 1910. In 1926, a National Father's Day Committee was formed in New York City. Father's Day was created by Congress in 1956. In 1972, President Richard Nixon established a permanent national observance of Father's Day to be held on the third Sunday of June. So Father's Day was born in memory and gratitude by a daughter who thought that her father, and all good fathers, should be honored with a special day just like we honor our mothers on Mother's Day.

We have also participated in local Habitat building programs. Our Women's Guild have prepared breakfasts for local building teams and this still continues - thank you ladies. Our Church School students and ACYOA Juniors – with their parents – have helped in building furniture for new homes under the leadership of Roseann Attar and Lisa Mardigian.

Habitat for Humanity of Oakland County is a volunteer-driven organization. With minimal staff, it depends on volunteers for support with projects like Construction, ReStore, Office Volunteering, and Teams (Committees). Construction volunteers assist by "swinging a hammer" on a house project. They also help with landscaping projects. Construction days are typically Tuesdays and Thursdays with occasional Saturdays. ReStore volunteers assist by providing customer service to those who are shopping and donating to our store. They help clean and organize donated items and take purchased items to cars. ReStore days are Mondays - Saturdays. To take a leadership role as a team leader or become a team member, you may assist with our 30 new Volunteer Teams. The Teams assist with projects related to construction, Habitat Affiliate Operations, Events, and ReStore efforts.

BAGS OF BLESSINGS ARE HERE FOR OUR YOUNG ONES

"Bags of Blessing for Young Children" are filled with items to encourage quiet entertainment for young children to use during the Divine Liturgy. The contents of the bag will help them sit quietly throughout the service while their parents are worshipping. Keep in mind that there are some small items, therefore, please use parental discretion as you look through the bag.

Inside the bag are approximately 8 board books ranging from short stories to picture books all with bible themes. Also in the bag is a 5 piece Nativity finger puppet set, 2 bible figurines that come with a small book telling the story of the person each figure represents, a pack of bible story cards that range from memory matching to bible hero stories, and a drawing board.

- For babies, there are soft finger puppets and board books to capture their attention as they quietly sit through the service.
- For toddlers, they too will enjoy flipping through the books, looking at the pictures, and playing with the other items in the bag.
- Older children will enjoy reading the short stories and using the set of cards to learn bible information.

The contents of the bags were designed for any child who has difficulty sitting still and focusing completely during the service, and at the same time, allow parents to focus more on aspects of worship.

The bags will be hanging on a stand at the entrance of the church sanctuary. When you take a bag for your child, be sure to return it and hang it back upon the stand.
